



Safeguarding Children – A Shared Responsibility

Will this course be useful to me in my job?

This training is for people who work regularly with children and young people and adults who are parents/ carers and have considerable professional and organisational responsibility for safeguarding and promoting children's welfare. It will focus on the processes, principles and dilemmas of working together effectively to safeguard and promote the welfare of children within a multi-agency context.

Course Pre-requisites

ALL participants must have already completed Basic Awareness in Child Abuse and Neglect training and Common Assessment Framework (CAF) - Information Sharing training either face to face or online prior to attendance.

This will give participants the opportunity to focus on the issues and practicalities of working together i.e. applying the relevant guidance and sharing decision making.

What does the course cover?

The course will focus on

- Inter-agency roles and responsibilities
- Inter-agency activities including information sharing
- Decision making at different stages of the safeguarding process
- Effective collaboration and communication

Who will present the course?

The course will be delivered by a multi-agency team with representatives from Bradford Safeguarding Children Board Safeguarding and Reviewing Unit, and lead trainers from the Primary Care Trust, Early Years and Childcare Services, Children's Social Care, Bradford University and Voluntary Sector.

When does the course run and how do I book?

The course will run from 09:30 to 16:30 (coffee/registration from 09:00) as follows:

- Monday 24th May 2010 – St Peters, Bradford 1
- Tuesday 29th June 2010 – New Mill, Saltaire
- Wednesday 20th October 2010 – St Peters, Bradford 1
- Thursday 3rd February 2011 – New Mill, Saltaire
