Thurs 10th April – CSE Champions Training (New Mill)*

This course will be of use to those nominated by their manager to be a Champion/Lead Professional in Safeguarding Children and Young People at Risk of Sexual Exploitation. It is designed to give those Lead Professionals specialist knowledge to help them to train and advise colleagues with respect to sexual exploitation concerns and multi agency working.

You must have completed our level 2 training on the subject 'Safeguarding Children and Young People at risk of Sexual Exploitation' before you can attend this training.

The course covers: The short term and long-term effects of sexual abuse; Caring for a child who has been sexually abused; Practical ways of helping an abused child; "Surviving" and services to assist adults who were sexually abused as children; Services available to (non abusing) parents and carers of children who have been sexually abused

Wed 4th June – Fabricated and Induced Illness (CNet, Shipley)


The course will highlight the indicators, dynamics and dangers associated with FII; it will enhance the knowledge and confidence of professionals in dealing with this issue and will explain the BSCB Policy "Safeguarding Children in whom illness is fabricated or induced".

Fri 6th June – CSE Managers Training (New Mill)*

This day is designed to give Managers and Lead Professionals specialist knowledge to help them to train and advise colleagues with respect to sexual exploitation concerns and multi agency working

Wed 18th June – CSE Champions Training (LRH)*

This course will be of use to those nominated by their manager to be a Champion/Lead Professional in Safeguarding Children and Young People at Risk of Sexual Exploitation. It is designed to give those Lead Professionals specialist knowledge to help them to train and advise colleagues with respect to sexual exploitation concerns and multi agency working.



Thurs 19th June (AM) – Homelessness – Implications for Working with Families, Children and Young People (New Mill)

The half day course covers: The criteria used for assisting people who present as homeless; Assistance for young people who are homeless; Links with Social Care and other Agencies; "Homehunter" services; How Child Protection cases may be affected by the application of Housing Law; Application of Housing Law to child care scenarios.

Tues 24th June – Domestic Abuse and Child Protection (New Mill)*

The course will cover: Recognising the link between domestic abuse and the need to safeguard children and young people, the range of effects on children and young people of experiencing domestic abuse in the family, different approaches to use when working with children who have experienced domestic abuse

Thurs 26th June - Core Groups – Making them work in a CP Case (St Peters)

The course covers: Core Groups – their use and value; signs of "dangerousness" and dangerous partnerships which can affect the outcome of a CP case; some lessons to be learned from Child Death Investigations in Bradford; the process of change.

Wed 2nd July – Forced Marriages and the Welfare of Young People (LRH)

The course will cover: The differences between arranged marriages and forced marriages; the cultural background; intervention strategies; the role of the Police and the Foreign and Commonwealth Office; the role of the Agencies, particularly Children's Social Care; the consequences of intervention.

Thurs 3rd July (AM) – Safeguarding Children on the Net (New Mill)*

This course covers: Developments in ICT and children's use of ICT; Risks to children – social networking – cyber – bullying; Adults, ICT and the sexual exploitation of children; Who is responsible for safeguarding children and what are the most effective ways of doing this?

Thurs 17th July – Hidden Dimensions of Abuse (New Mill)*

Tues 16th September (AM) - Delivering services to parents with learning difficulty and their children – the issues and dilemmas - Managers (St Peters)*

The course covers: An overview of current legislation and guidance; Making best use of resources whilst meeting the needs of families; Meeting the challenges of multidisciplinary working; Engaging and supporting staff in good practice approaches



Fri 19th September – Serious Case Reviews and the lessons to be learned (St Peters)*

The course covers: What is a Serious Case Review; How is such a Review conducted and managed in Bradford; Your role in such a Review; Your role in relation to staff involved in the case; Lessons from Reviews locally and nationally

Tues 23rd September (AM) – Allegations Management (New Mill)*

Wed 1st October – Working with Parents with Learning Disabilities (Practitioners) (CNet)*

This training will provide the opportunity to consider the different roles and responsibilities practitioners have and how to develop practice to improve support for parents with learning difficulties and their children.

Tues 7th October - Safeguarding Children and Young People at risk of Sexual Exploitation (Bradford Youth Service, City Road)*

The course covers: Exploration of the extent of the problem in this area; understanding why; support and assistance to children and young people; the role of the Agencies; the role of the Police; contents of the Inter-Agency Protocol

Wed 8th October – Hidden Dimensions of Abuse (St Peters)*

This is an integrated training course regarding the abuse of vulnerable adults, domestic abuse and safeguarding children. Practitioners from a range of both adult and children's services will benefit from this course which promotes a holistic and inclusive approach to interventions.

Mon 13th October – Working with Families and Children who are not UK Citizens (New Mill)

The course will aim to cover: The legal issues relating to the position of non UK Citizens; the problems of non UK Citizens in Bradford and district; the problems that professionals encounter in trying to give a good service; the services available locally and nationally; the pooling of ideas to enable a better service to be given

Thurs 16th October – Attachment (St Peters)

The course will cover: What is attachment; Development of attachment; Attachment and attunement; the effects of early abuse and neglect on brain and behaviour; Effects of separation in infancy; Facilitating attachment bonds.

Wed 5th November – Understanding the Effects of Child Sexual Abuse (St Peters)

The course covers: The short term and long-term effects of sexual abuse; Caring for a child who has been sexually abused; Practical ways of helping an abused child; “Surviving” and services to assist adults who were sexually abused as children; Services available to (non abusing) parents and carers of children who have been sexually abused

Fri 7th November – Child Injury Prevention Training (New Mill)*

This course is relevant to all practitioners working with parents and carers of children and young people in the local community. This course will provide the opportunity to gain an awareness of the impact if unintentional child injuries in the Bradford District and how they can be prevented.



Mon 10th November – How the Police Investigate Cases of Child Abuse (New Mill)*

The course covers: Handling Disclosures – including how to ask questions; police procedures and how a case is investigated (including investigations with Children’s Social Care); what is evidence; difficulties in prosecuting this type of case; criminal and Care Proceedings

Tues 11th November – Young People who go Missing (New Mill)*

To understand why young people go missing and gain an insight to preventing and responding to the problem including the role of Children’s Social Care, Education, Connexions, Barnardos and the Police

Thurs 13th November – Safeguarding Children – A Shared Responsibility (St Peters)*

The course will cover the fundamental rights known as Human Right and Data Protection, especially those aspects which affect Child Protection work. We will look at prospective breaches and justifications for actions which may breach human rights and issues around sharing information.

Tues 3rd February – Child Injury Prevention Training (St Peters)*

This course is relevant to all practitioners working with parents and carers of children and young people in the local community. This course will provide the opportunity to gain an awareness of the impact of unintentional child injuries in the Bradford District and how they can be prevented.

Thurs 5th February – Safeguarding Children – A Shared Responsibility (St Peters)*

This training is for people who work regularly with children and young people and adults who are parents/carers and have considerable professional and organisational responsibility for safeguarding and promoting children's welfare. It will focus on the processes, principles and dilemmas of working together effectively to safeguard and promote the welfare of children within a multi agency context.

Tues 24th February – Disability and Safeguarding Children (New Mill)

The course aims to: Give further understanding of vulnerability; give further understanding of the effects disability can have on workers; explore protective strategies; share ideas and innovative practice; explore different forms of communication and emphasise the importance of working together

You must have completed the specialist 'Child Injury Prevention Training' to do this further training

Fri 6th March – Anti-Bullying Training (New Mill)*

This course will be relevant to all staff/professionals who work directly with young people. This course will provide an opportunity to gain awareness of the impact bullying can have on young people.

Tues 10th March – Safeguarding Children – A Shared Responsibility (New Mill)*

This training is for people who work regularly with children and young people and adults who are parents/carers and have considerable professional and organisational responsibility for safeguarding and promoting children's welfare. It will focus on the processes, principles and dilemmas of working together effectively to safeguard and promote the welfare of children within a multi agency context.
